The **(post)industrial heritage and landscapes** are part of the conservation and management of modern architectural heritage and landscape discourse, and should be addressed not as relics of the past but as local resources for the future able to trigger conscious transformations that create liveable and sustainable places for their communities. Reinterpreting former industrial sites and reintroducing them into new heritage-value production cycles is necessary. **The (post) industrial heritage and landscape need to be considered as a present-day asset.** The challenges lie in balancing the protection of their polyhedral value with possible adaptation and transformation interventions. Hence, addressing the complexity of (post)industrial landscapes requires an integration of methods and disciplines. The question of how to assess and what to do with them is highly relevant to present-day. **Under which perspectives and how can we explore, document, investigate and interpret (post)industrial heritage and landscapes?**

The Land-In-Pro Seminar Cycle and Co-creation- activities, part of the project “Landscapes of Industrial Production - Documenting and Assessing 20th century (post)Industrial Landscapes as Resources”, funded by the Ministry of University and Research under the Italian National Recovery and Resilience Plan and the NextGenerationEU, **aims to bring together experts, researchers, and students to discuss challenges and issues related to (post)industrial heritage and landscapes from various perspectives.** Results of the Co-creation activities will be shared on the project’s Instagram feed.
